The Masters: Leonardo da Vinci The great draftsman.

Head of a Young Woman (Study for the Angel in 'Virgin of the Rocks') by Leonardo da Vinci

Leonardo da Vinci's drawings are renowned for their artistic skill and scientific insight. Notable examples include anatomical studies (like the Vitruvian Man), detailed studies of drapery, and designs for machines. Among a group of drawings depicting "Divine and Worldly Beauty" is *Head of a Young Woman (Study for the Angel in the "Virgin of the Rocks")* about 1483–85. It is said to be the most beautiful drawing in the world by art historian Sir Kenneth Clark. The *Virgin of the Rocks* (in the Louvre Museum)



represents a universally admired example of Leonardo's ideal of feminine beauty.



Leonardo da Vinci (1452-1519) was a painter, sculptor, architect, writer, anatomist, geologist, astronomer, botanist, inventor, engineer and scientist – the epitome of a Renaissance man. Born in a farmhouse outside the village of Anchiano, in Tuscany, on 14/15 April 1452, Leonardo was the child of Ser Piero, a wealthy Florentine notary, and an unmarried peasant woman named Caterina. He did not finish his first commissions as he was pulled away by the Milano Sforza family to paint *The Last Supper*. He spent 17 years in Milan until the Duke Sforza's fall from power. He was also a musician and a chronic procrastinator—not a prolific painter due to his broad interests. Along with the works for the Duke of Milan, Leonardo's most

substantial commissioned work was for Ludovico il Moro, called *Gran Cavallo* or 'Leonardo's Horse' in 1482. For the Duke Sforza's father, Francesco Sforza, there was proposed a statue of the senior Sforza on horseback which was to be more than 25 feet tall and intended to be the largest equestrian statue in the world. Leonardo spent nearly 17 years planning the statue. But before it was completed, French forces invaded Milan in 1499. The clay sculpture was used for target practice by the victorious French soldiers, shattering it to pieces. Leonardo died on 2nd May 1519 at age 67 of acute stroke at Amboise, France. He was careful to leave his drawings – 2000 or more loose sheets, and dozens of notebooks – to his pupil Francesco Melzi.

Workshop: Jeremy Ford pastels, 28th June

What a great workshop! We learned how mats work differently from normal pastel paper. And by using rubbing alcohol you can layer the pastels using a brush or spray bottle to apply the alcohol. Let it dry completely before continuing. Although Unison pastels are the holy grail in the UK, Jackson's own make 2nd best according to Jeremy. He suggests using sable or synthetic brushes to brush away excess dust.

SKETCHING REPORT, CHIPSTEAD

















SKETCHING REPORT SHOREHAM, KENT


Wednesday 18th June was another beautiful day when we met up in Shoreham. We started the day with a coffee at the Mount Vineyard that is 'hidden' off the main road
